

South Hillsboro Pipeline

The Willamette Water Supply Program is coordinating with the City of Hillsboro and developers to install a portion of the new water pipeline through the South Hillsboro area in conjunction with other essential public infrastructure projects. The coordinated construction effort will result in cost savings, reduced traffic impacts and fewer construction projects.

In the spring of 2017, construction began on the extensions of Cornelius Pass Road and Blanton Street, the main transportation network serving South Hillsboro. The road extensions, and the associated water pipeline installation, will occur in phases as part of the South Hillsboro development.

Phase I: Blanton to TV Highway

The first phase of the Cornelius Pass Road extension includes improvements to the Cornelius Pass/TV Highway intersection, an at-grade railroad crossing, and a new road through part of the Reed's Crossing development, south of TV Highway. A portion of the Willamette Water Supply Pipeline through South Hillsboro was installed under the improved Cornelius Pass/TV Highway intersection. This tunnel was the first Willamette Water Supply trenchless road crossing.

The water pipeline was also installed south along the future Cornelius Pass Road alignment, through South Hillsboro, to the connection with the Blanton Street extension where Phase I pipeline construction ends. This portion of the pipeline will connect to the existing City of Hillsboro water system to serve the residential development anticipated to be completed in 2018 – well before the remaining Willamette Water Supply pipeline is completed in 2026.

Future Phases

Future phases of the pipeline in the South Hillsboro area are scheduled to begin as soon as 2018. The next phase will be coordinated with Washington County's widening of Cornelius Pass Road between TV Highway and Francis Street. A third phase will continue the pipeline south to Rosedale Road, ultimately connecting to the rest of the pipeline at Farmington Road via 209th Avenue.

Tualatin Valley Water District (TVWD) and the City of Hillsboro are partnering to develop the mid-Willamette River at Wilsonville as an additional water supply. When completed in 2026, this new system will be one of Oregon's most seismically-resilient drinking water systems—built to better withstand natural disasters, protect public health, and provide a stable water supply for present and future generations.
