

124th Avenue Extension and Pipeline Project

The first section of the Willamette Water Supply Program's new water transmission line is under construction as part of Washington County's 124th Avenue Extension Project.

Washington County is extending 124th Avenue north from Wilsonville to Tualatin-Sherwood Road to improve regional mobility and provide access to future commercial and industrial lands between Tualatin and Sherwood. The new road extension will include one travel lane in each direction. In addition to the 124th Avenue extension, safety improvements will be made on Tonquin Road and Grahams Ferry Road.

The Willamette Water Supply Program and Washington County are partnering to install a portion of the new pipeline during construction of the 124th Avenue extension. This partnership highlights the shared benefits of government collaboration by reducing traffic and construction impacts, and saving taxpayers and ratepayers millions of dollars.

Construction of the pipeline and new roadway began in spring 2016, and is scheduled to be complete in 2018.

This Willamette Water Supply Program pipeline segment will be capped and filled with water to ensure stability until the rest of the pipeline is constructed. The pipeline is anticipated to be fully operational in 2026.

Our Future Water Supply

The Willamette Water Supply Program is a partnership between Tualatin Valley Water District and the City of Hillsboro to develop the mid-Willamette River at Wilsonville as an additional water supply source. This new system, when operational in 2026, will provide a reliable water supply for the region while also helping water system operators balance supply during times of drought or other supply interruptions, and recover more quickly after a large natural disaster.
