

## 124th Avenue Extension and Pipeline Project

### Construction Fact Sheet

Washington County's 124th Avenue extension project will construct a new two-lane arterial roadway between Tualatin-Sherwood Road and Grahams Ferry Road. As part of this project, safety improvements will also be made to sections of Tonquin Road and Grahams Ferry Road, totaling 4.4 miles of new and/or improved roadway.

The Willamette Water Supply Program is partnering with Washington County on this road project to construct the first segment of the more than 30-mile-long water transmission pipeline in the road right-of-way.

Construction for the road and pipeline project began in spring 2016, with completion anticipated in 2018. Though it will be almost a decade before the water transmission pipeline is put to use, the coordinated construction of the pipeline with the new road will result in significant cost savings for water ratepayers and will minimize community impacts by eliminating the need for multiple construction projects.

During construction, the project team will strive to minimize impacts to residents and businesses.

- Construction will generally occur between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Monday - Saturday.
- If nighttime or Sunday construction is necessary, required approvals will be obtained.
- Contractors will abide by noise limits and other construction standards set by local jurisdictions.
- Along Tualatin-Sherwood Road, Tonquin Road and Grahams Ferry Road, lane restrictions will occur between 9 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. to avoid peak commute times.
- Construction zones will be well marked, and flaggers will guide traffic when necessary.

### Our Future Water Supply

**The Willamette Water Supply Program is a partnership between Tualatin Valley Water District and the City of Hillsboro to develop the mid-Willamette River at Wilsonville as an additional water supply source.** This new system, when operational in 2026, will provide a reliable water supply for the region while also helping water system operators balance supply during times of drought or other supply interruptions, and recover more quickly after a large natural disaster.
