

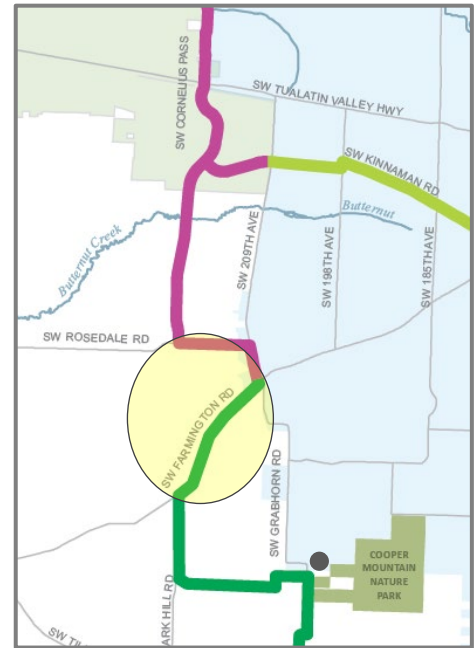
Preferred Route Selected: Grabhorn Road to Rosedale Road (PLM 5.3)

After an extensive study, the Willamette Water Supply Program has selected a preferred South Hillsboro/Farmington Road/Clark Hill water transmission pipeline route (see study area graphic).

Analysis of the preliminary design alignment, along Clark Hill Road and Farmington Road, identified significant seismic risks. Several alternative pipeline alignments were studied and analyzed for seismic stability, environmental impacts, community impacts, construction feasibility, and opportunities to partner or coordinate with Washington County.

The new preferred pipeline route is depicted in the graphic below. South of Farmington Road, the alignment generally parallels the existing Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) corridor on private property. North of Farmington Road, the alignment is within a potential future road corridor through private property.

This section of large-diameter transmission Scholls Ferry Area Pipeline Project will connect to the section currently under construction to the south on Tile Flat Road, the future water storage tank site on Cooper Mountain, and the future pipeline through South Hillsboro to the north.



Study Area



This pipeline route refinement is included in the most recent map and schedule update found at www.OurReliableWater.org. The map update also reflects changes to the previous alignment for the Beaverton Area Pipeline Project (PLE_1.0). This alignment was revised and renamed to the Metzger Pipeline East Project (MPE_1.0) after studies concluded the Metzger alignment provides cost efficiency and reduces construction and environmental impacts compared to the original route.

Next Steps

- Further design and analysis of this section of pipeline will continue through 2020. Design is anticipated to be complete in 2021.
- The land use process is anticipated to occur in the second half of 2020.
- As needed, easement acquisition conversations with property owners are anticipated in the second half of 2020.
- Pipeline construction is currently scheduled to begin in 2022 and be completed in 2024.
