

Upcoming Utility Relocation Work

Utility lines that are located in the road right of way in front of Brookside Apartments and at Merry Lane are being relocated. Moving these utilities will allow for future Willamette Water Supply System (WWSS) Metzger Pipeline East (MPE_1.2) Project construction.

Moving the power and telecommunication lines from the pipeline work area benefits customers and the pipeline crew. The activity reduces the risk of potential service impacts to customers and reduces the risk of worker injury if a utility is struck during construction. Please ensure you and others in your care obey safety signage for the upcoming work.

PGE will be installing, replacing, or relocating the equipment to improve the utility infrastructure and power reliability in partnership with the WWSS. After the PGE work, each telecommunication company using the pole will relocate their line. For more information and to inquire about any potential service disruptions, contact

your service provider. Service provider lines being relocated include PGE, Lumen/Centurylink, Comcast, Electric Lightwave, Ziplly, and One Fiber/Level 3.

Construction of the seismically resilient Willamette Water Supply System drinking water pipeline is underway. Those living, traveling, working, and shopping along portions of SW Scholls Ferry Road, SW Hall Boulevard, SW Cascade Avenue, SW Allen Boulevard and Western Avenue can expect construction until the fall of 2024.

Crews anticipate beginning installation of a tunnel for the pipeline beneath upper Fanno Creek in early 2023. The tunnel spans from the north end of Merry Lane to the lawn area of Brookside Apartments. The Willamette Water Supply System (WWSS) MPE_1.0 project is a partnership between the Tualatin Valley Water District (TVWD), City of Hillsboro, and City of Beaverton to build a new seismically resilient drinking water system by 2026. The project combines planned improvements by TVWD with WWSS and the City of Beaverton water construction projects. The combined project maximizes cost-effectiveness and reduces community and environmental construction impacts. Those living, traveling, working, and shopping along portions of SW Scholls Ferry Road, SW Hall Boulevard, SW Cascade Avenue, SW Allen Boulevard and Western Avenue can expect various construction activities from the fall of 2021 until the fall of 2024.
