

Pipeline Installation Resumes near SW Scholls Ferry Road and Roy Rogers Road

Pipeline installation around the intersection of SW Roy Rogers Road and SW Scholls Ferry Road resumes Sept. 11th as crews intermittently perform both nightwork and daywork in the area.

Daywork will consist of installing pipe, valves, and connecting previously installed pipe to the newly installed line that runs west on Scholls Ferry Road. During this work a right turn lane closure will be in place M-F from 7 am-3:30 pm, and a full-time sidewalk closure with pedestrian detour will be in effect until the work is complete. Work is anticipated from Sept. 11-Oct. 4, then again for about a week in December or January. Additionally, an underground power connection will be completed this fall. Details about the power connection will be posted on the project website www.ourreliablewater.org/mpe once more details are known.

Nightwork will consist of installing pipeline across the Roy Rogers Road at Scholls Ferry Road intersection. Construction is tentatively planned for M-Th nights from 7 pm to 6 am, Sept. 30th-Nov. 1st. Expect lane restrictions, signal shutdowns, flaggers, and alternating crosswalk closures during this work.

Please take extra care when traveling through construction areas, and plan extra time into your trips.

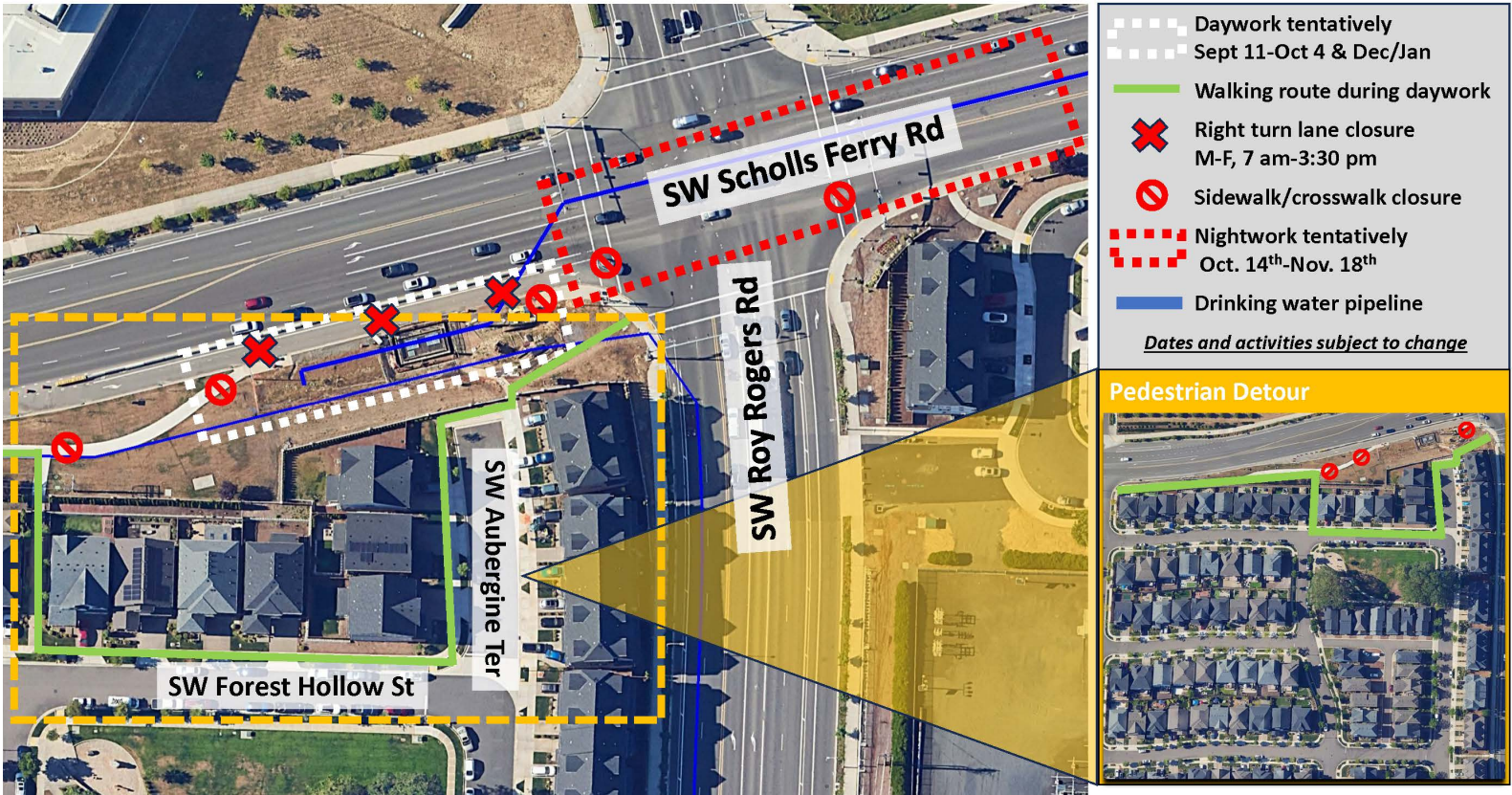
Nighttime Construction

We're working hard to minimize the noise generated during the nighttime hours. Those fronting Scholls Ferry Road can expect noise and vibration resulting from construction. Please know that we are working as quickly and safely as possible to limit the duration of the construction impacts. Things around your home that can help mitigate the noise include:

- Foam earplugs
- Thick curtains
- Noise-canceling headphones
- White-noise machine

The project team has secured noise variances to perform this night work, and are working with the City of Beaverton, City of Tigard, Washington County, Oregon Department of Transportation and other regulating agencies to make sure we are abiding by codes and regulations.

The Willamette Water Supply System (WWSS) MPE_1.0 project is a partnership between the Tualatin Valley Water District (TVWD), City of Hillsboro, and City of Beaverton to build a new seismically resilient drinking water system by 2026. The project combines planned improvements by TVWD with WWSS and the City of Beaverton water construction projects. The combined project maximizes cost-effectiveness and reduces community and environmental construction impacts. Those living, traveling, working, and shopping along portions of SW Scholls Ferry Road, SW Hall Boulevard, SW Cascade Avenue, SW Allen Boulevard and Western Avenue can expect various construction activities from the fall of 2021 until the fall of 2024.
